Course summary

This module is designed for practitioners who are proficient in the care and treatment of patients who have continence difficulties. It provides an opportunity for you to demonstrate your knowledge and gain academic credit for doing so.

Students will demonstrate their role as key players within the multidisciplinary team, utilising a problem solving approach to assess people who experience continence difficulties and to subsequently implement management strategies that focus on rehabilitative measures.

Course outline

The course has been validated to ensure that it reflects evidence-based practice. The course may be studied at either academic Level 3 (Degree) or M (Masters). You will be awarded 20 credits at the relevant level on successful completion of the course.

Prerequisites

Participants (with a healthcare background) who undertake this module are required to be working frequently with adults who have continence issues. Participants are permitted to take the module at a single academic level only. Participants are **not** required to be members of the ACA

Delivery

This is a part-time, course, consisting of 184 hours of self-directed learning.

Duration

Duration is flexible. Assignment submission must be within a year of the date of registration. The course consists 184 hours of self-directed learning.
